" Federal Level

WASHINGTON, DC UPDATE

The Nourish Colorado staff has been in Washington, DC this week meeting with a federal delegation. We've learned the following.

1. Legislators are not hearing a lot of concern regarding food access. See action item #1 below.

2. Legislators NEED to keep hearing loud and clear how powerful these federal programs are in communities. See action item #2 below.

Item #1: URGENT: Call your senators and representatives to oppose cuts to SNAP and Medicaid

What happened?

Last Friday, Senate Republican leaders <u>released a budget plan</u> that intends to increase border control, homeland security & military spending.

Where To Grow from Here (Continued...)

Why does this matter?

Budget resolutions could put Medicaid and the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), and possibly other programs, at risk.

What can I do about it?

• Contact Senator Bennett to oppose cuts to SNAP, NOW!

• <u>Keep contacting House Representatives Evans, Crank & Hurd</u> to oppose potential cuts to SNAP & Medicaid.

• Three things you can do right now to protect SNAP

Item #2: Share stories of the power of federal investment in community

Why does this matter?

Legislators are not thinking of the people who rely on federal programs that budget cuts will ultimately affect.

What can I do about it?

State Level

Item #1: Bill of Interest - Prohibiting Price Gouging in Sales of Necessities

What happened?

HB25-1010 was introduced on January 8, 2025. The bill adds price gouging of necessities as an unfair and unconscionable act under Colorado's consumer protection laws.

Why does this matter?

• This bill would protect the general public in Colorado from an unfair price increase in "necessities" such as goods or services that are necessary for health, safety, and welfare.

• The bill adds, that engaging in price gouging in the sale of necessities is an unfair act and creates a presumption that if the price of a necessity is increased by 10% or more above the average price that the necessity cost during the 90 days preceding the price increase, the price increase amounts to price gouging.

What can I do about it?

Track HB25-1010, and be on the lookout for future action items from us.

Summary of HB25-1010

Following Up

<u>Last week</u>, Nourish Colorado shared concerns on how the federal funding freeze could affect <u>Local Food for Schools</u> funding. We are excited to share that the USDA has issued an official Request for Proposal from states to establish cooperative agreements with the USDA so that funds may be disbursed. Colorado will be receiving an estimated \$5.9 million in funding to support the purchasing of local foods for K-12 and ECE institutions!
